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## TRIALS OF SOCIAL PERMACULTURE ONLINE COURSE FOR YOUTH WORKERS IN CYPRUS, ITALY, GERMANY AND MALTA!

The Trials of the training Course on Social Permaculture for Youth Workers across Cyprus, Italy, Germany, and Malta showcased diverse experiences. In Limassol, Cyprus, an engaging session with 18 participants highlighted the curriculum's positive impact, fostering effective conveyance of permaculture concepts to young minds. In Dresden, Germany, the trials epitomized interactive learning, featuring lively discussions on permaculture ethics and hands-on gardening activities that resonated with community engagement. Meanwhile, in Italy, sessions led by La Fenice APS offered valuable insights into sustainability where participants engaged in module presentations and website revision. Participants saw social permaculture as a tool for fostering citizenship and personal skills in youth.

Similarly in Malta, PRISMS united 19 youth workers and educators, whom acknowledged the necessity of such projects to fill the knowledge gap among youth workers and educators. Many committed to dedicating more time to grasp the material, recognizing its potential significance in their daily work with youth. Collectively, there's a resounding acknowledgment of the course's potential impact, fostering a commitment to delve deeper into the material for its integration into daily work with young individuals.

## NASPLY Transnational meeting in Dresden - December 2023



#### **Learn more about NASPLY**

The project NASPLY is a cooperation partnership that aims to tackle the environmental and climate crisis, increase social inclusion, increase life-skills of marginalised youth and improve wellbeing through the holistic permaculture approach that focuses on building resilience in communities, answering to the needs of young people.

We will use Social and Nature Permaculture as theory for non-formal learning. Social permaculture focuses on the principles of permaculture design, extrapolated onto a societal level i.e. it looks at creating resilient communities where people understand their worth in society, what their role is in proving this, how they can learn from nature to have a strong social ecosystem.

NASPLY focuses on building resilient communities and especially on youth with fewer opportunities.

Through this project, we will develop knowledge for youth workers on regenerative social permaculture for lifeskill development for youth, so youth workers will be trained in non-formal education tools to implement social permaculture and facilitate the creation of permaculture gardens with the youths.
